NOTICE OF PARTISAN PRIMARY AND REFERENDUM AND SAMPLE BALLOT AUGUST 14, 2018

OFFICE OF THE OUTAGAMIE COUNTY CLERK
TO THE VOTERS OF OUTAGAMIE COUNTY AND PARTS OF CALUMET (VILLAGE OF HARRISON & CITY OF APPLETON) & WINNEBAGO (CITY OF APPLETON) COUNTIES:
(Note: City of New London publishes separately – County information is listed in this Notice.)

Notice is hereby given of a partisan primary to be held in Outagamie County and parts of Calumet (Village of Harrison & City of Appleton) and Winnebago (City of Appleton) Counties on August 14, 2018, at which the nominees for the offices named below shall be chosen. The names of the candidates for each office, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are given under the title of the office under the appropriate party, each in its proper column, together with the questions submitted to a vote, if any, in the sample ballot below.

INFORMATION TO VOTERS

Upon entering the polling place, a voter shall state his or her name and address, show an acceptable form of photo identification and sign the poll book before being permitted to vote. If a voter is not registered to vote, a voter may register to vote at the polling place serving his or her residence, if the voter presents proof of residence in a form specified by law. Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot. Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall retire alone to a voting booth and cast his or her ballot except that a voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or minor ward. An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote, but the official may not in any manner advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

At the partisan primary, the voter shall select the party of his or her choice. Voting for candidates of more than one party may invalidate the ballot. You must cast a vote for individual candidates.

Where Optical Scan Voting is used

- If a party preference *is designated*, and votes are cast for ballot candidates of another party or write-in votes are cast in another party, only votes cast in the designated party will count.
- If a party preference *is not designated*, and votes are cast for candidates (or write-in votes are cast) in more than one party, no votes will be counted.

Within the party of his or her choice, the voter shall fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate of his or her choice for each office for which he or she intends to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of his or her choice in the space provided for a write-in vote, and fill in the oval next to the write-in line. On referendum questions, the voter shall fill in the oval next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall fill in the oval next to "no" if opposed to the question. For the Town of Freedom referendum, you may only vote once in this referendum. If you vote for both options, no votes will count.

When using an *electronic ballot marking device* (“Automark” or “ExpressVote”) to mark an optical scan ballot, the voter shall touch the screen next to the party of his or her choice. The voter shall then touch the screen at the name of the candidate of his or her choice for each office for which he or she intends to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall type in the name of the person of his or her choice in the space provided for a write-in vote. On referendum questions, the voter shall touch the screen at "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall touch the screen at "no" if opposed to the question. For the Town of Freedom referendum, the voter shall choose one of the two options.

The vote should not be cast in any other manner. Not more than five minutes’ time shall be allowed inside a voting booth. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in marking his or her vote may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked.

If a voter spoils an **optical scan** ballot, he or she shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the voter shall return it to the election official, who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.

After Voting the Ballot

After an official **optical scan** ballot is marked, it shall be inserted in the security sleeve so the marks do not show. The voter shall then insert the ballot in the voting device and discard the sleeve, or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. If a central count system is used, the voter shall insert the ballot in the ballot box and discard the sleeve, or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting his or her vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that he or she is unable to read, has difficulty reading, writing or understanding English or that due to disability is unable to cast his or her ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that at a referendum election to be held during the Partisan Primary Election in the Town of Greenville on August 14, 2018, on the following proposed Initial Resolution will be submitted to a vote of the people:

INITIAL RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$6,500,000 FOR CONSTRUCTING AND EQUIPPING A NEW FIRE AND SAFETY BUILDING

BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Greenville, Outagamie County, Wisconsin that there shall be issued pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$6,500,000 for the public purpose of financing the constructing and equipping of a new Fire and Safety Building.

The question will appear on the ballot as follows:

“Shall the Town of Greenville, Outagamie County, Wisconsin be authorized to issue pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$6,500,000 for the public purpose of financing the constructing and equipping of a new Fire and Safety Building?”

EXPLANATION

The referendum election ballot will ask Town electors to vote "yes" or "no" on the referendum election question as set forth above.

A "yes" vote on the question is a vote to approve the borrowing of \$6,500,000 by the Town of Greenville through the issuance of general obligation bonds for the purpose of financing the constructing and equipping a new Fire and Safety Building.

A "no" vote on the question is a vote to deny the Town of Greenville the authority to borrow \$6,500,000 through the issuance of general obligation bonds for the purpose of financing the constructing and equipping a new Fire and Safety Building.

In the event a majority of the electors voting on the question vote "Yes", the Town will be authorized to undertake the project described in the question and borrow not in excess of \$6,500,000 therefor; if a majority vote "No" on the question set forth above, the Town will not be so authorized.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the advisory referendum question be as set forth in the Notice of Referendum attached to this Resolution, and incorporated herein as follows:

The Town Board for the Town of Freedom, Outagamie County, Wisconsin, has determined

that its current facilities are inadequate, and in the case of its fire, police and first responders facilities, do not meet minimum requirements for such facilities. Therefore, the Town Board is requesting that you select ONE (1) of the following options:

1. Construct a new 39,245 square foot town hall, fire department, police department and first responder municipal complex, on the Town's property at County E and Schmidt Road, at an estimated cost of \$9,700,000; or
2. Construct a new 46,440 square foot town hall, fire department, police department and first responder municipal complex, on the Town's property at County E and Schmidt Road, at an estimated cost of \$11,480,000.

By voting for one of the above options, you are indicating your preference for that option over the other specified option. The Town Board intends to use the results of this advisory referendum to assist it in making a final decision on the upgrading of the Town of Freedom's municipal facilities.

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town Clerk shall publish the Notice of Referendum in accordance with the procedures set forth at § 10.01(2) and § 10.06(3) of the Wisconsin Statutes.
