

## **Planning and Zoning Guide**

### **Town vs County Zoning**

- Most towns in Outagamie County are under county zoning jurisdiction. However, a few towns have elected to create and administer their own zoning codes. The towns that have elected to administer their own zoning include:
  - Black Creek
  - Hortonia
  - Greenville
  - Grand Chute
  - Kaukauna
  - Buchanan
- Every other town, with the exception of Maine (which does not have zoning) is zoned by the county. The county does not have jurisdiction or permitting authority within any of the cities or villages located within the county, such as the City of Appleton.

### **Comprehensive Planning**

- Comprehensive planning law, enacted in 1999 in Wisconsin, requires local municipalities to adopt Comprehensive Plans and update them every ten years. Comprehensive Planning is different from zoning in that it provides the framework or structure in which land use decisions should be made. Different elements are discussed when updating a comprehensive plan, including Issues and Opportunities, Housing, Agriculture, Economic Development, Transportation, and more.
